


Concept Mapping

A **concept map** is a diagram showing the relationships among concepts. It is a graphical tool for organizing and representing knowledge. Concepts, usually represented as boxes or circles, are connected with labeled arrows in a downward-branching hierarchical structure. Students can use the concept maps to organize and remember information.

Concept Map
